## **County Office of Education Migrant Education Program**

### **Purpose**

The Migrant Education Program provides academic and support services to children and young adults (ages 3–21) who relocate frequently due to their parents' or their own search for migrant agricultural work, and as a result interrupt their education. The Migrant Education program partners with schools, local community agencies, and families to increase migrant student academic success.

The county currently has more than 28,000 migrant students and out-of-school youth. Sixteen county school districts host Migrant Education classrooms that provide quality academic and support services year-round.

### **Services**

The Migrant Education Program provides the following services:

- Migrant Education Even Start (MEES) for preschool children
- Extended day, weekend and summer programs for all K-12 students
- Leadership academies for middle and high school students
- Individual tutoring for all K-12 students
- Academic tutoring and support for out-of-school youth
- Parent training and support

### **Eligibility Requirements**

Migrant Education services are available to:

- Preschool- and school-age children of migrant workers who have moved across school district boundaries in the last three years seeking temporary or seasonal employment in the agriculture, dairy, or fishing industries
- Out-of-school youth up to 21 years of age who have moved across school district boundaries in the last three years seeking temporary or seasonal employment in the agriculture, dairy, or fishing industries
